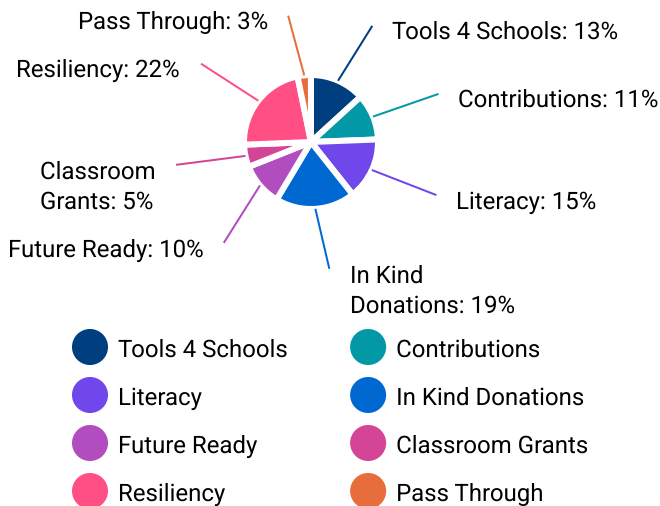

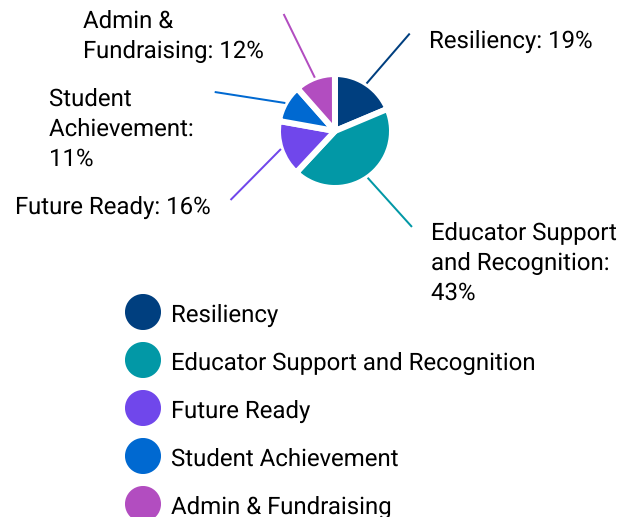

Outcomes

- 100% of teachers using the Tools 4 Schools resource reported the program made them a more effective educator and likely to continue teaching in the district.
- 94% of teachers reported their students were more interested in taking more STEM classes after using the grant materials
- 100% of students participating in the Future Ready Clay Financial Literacy Project gained confidence in personal finance.
